The purpose of this meeting is to discuss the coding and processing of airfare-related data by the airline industry, to make the distribution and interpretation of airfare-related data more efficient. Mostly testing so far...


- + Approximately 13 "Not Permitted" Tables (may be some test)

#### Tickets Issued Prior to the Migration (update)

Considering 5 of 9 responses were in support of the approach to pursue a <u>Processing Hierarchy</u> and the remaining were split between defaulting to sales date and migration date.

**Next Steps** - ATPCO proposes to write up data application defining the Processing Hierarchy to handle tickets issued during the migration and issue a Milestone 2 & 3 (high-level and detailed design).
